

Buffalo - July 6, 1864.

7½ P.M.

My dear Lucy:

"The Plains" between Buffalo and Williamsville were, it is said, Oak Springs, when the first White men came into this region, covered with tall grasses, which were regularly feed by the Indians, in latter Summer, to draw hither the game, by the temptation of fresh herbage in the Autumn. The underlying rock comes close to the surface, & is a limestone filled with horn-stone. I need not say to you that, in the heat of Summer, the plains are exceedingly dry. I took a short stroll on them, this afternoon, in the day time - and there, snatched up the inclosed tuft (the only one I saw) of a sun-dried, withered thing,

which may be the little Scipus I
sent you. If it be, Mummy must
have played me a strange trick,
and it must have been something
else which I picked at the cran-
berry marsh near Akron. If it
be that Scipus, and I live and
am here next year, you shall
have a cock of it.

I also enclose to you, from The
Plain, two species of the *Triticum*
repens v. *perennale*, of my un-
fortunate list - which is named in
the antiquity of Dr. Thunber. You
subsequently decided it to be a
variety of *T. caninum*. Mr. L. Hall,
to whom I sent it with the things,
wrote that he was glad to get
it from this part of the country - that
he had collected it, or had it (I for-
get which) from the Rocky Mt., &
was confident that it was neither
repens nor *caninum*.

I can assure you that it has no rom-
mily nut stock. I enclose it thinking
you might possibly be pleased to re-
examine it; and I can safely promise
you any quantity and in any
condition that you may desire.

I am especially obliged for the
Scleropodium Selago^{es}. It is very dif-
ferent from what I had imagined.

I am much obliged to you for
the acquaintance of the Rev. J. A. Soule.
He is a clever fellow. I am over my
duplication - or the large portion of
them - with him. I made up a
quite a package, with which he
started off, last evening, expressing
himself much pleased.
