delay my return to Albany
till the 6th. & Mr. Seymour
went back yesterday, that
I might accept Mr. Schenck's
& also spend this day with
Professor & Mr. Newcomb -
I have been amused &
also interested in New York,

Still the pleasures of Lakes
& Forests are not as great
for me as those of the
Lakes & Forests - & I long
to find leaves & flowers
again by turning my
Steps Southwards - However
as I have no intention
of coming again to N York
next year, I shall stay
a little longer between
Albany & this place - &
so do not expect to arrive
at Washington before the
middle or end of this
month - On Thursday
The Gov. & Mr. Seymour
will meet me at
West point - I shall

then return with them to
Albany, & spend two or
three days more here in
my way to Pennsylvania
Baltimore & Washington.
Do you intend to meet
me next year for the
Forest expedition from
Rochester? Governor
Mr. Seymour promises
to join it, & he is - even
still better acquainted
with the Northern Lakes
& Forests of this State,
than Mr. Seely - I hope
I shall be drowned going
to Cuba & to prevent such
a charming expedition - Love
