Let me tell in plain words the history of  
discovering *Salvinia natans*. L.

On a mycological excursion in the  
Bois brule-bottom of Perry Co., 18 Miles east  
from Perryville Mo. I found Sal. last October  
(1885) pure accidentaliter. About 300 steps  
west of Dixon's lake in said bottom (at the west of  
Fred Goldschauer's sawmill) I came to a

slough, which was covered all over with  
the beautfull red *Azolla Caroliniana* Willd.  
By fishing it out with a long pole I found  
in the masses specimens of *Selvinia*. This  
no Idea, that it would be so rare, because  
I found Salo. in Woods' Clew-book of Botany  
enumerated in our Flora.

Feis days before Christmas (1885)  
Dr Edward Vogt, Friedheim Cape Girardeau  
& Mo. payd me a visit, telling me he  
had found a Tree Malva without  
Thorns & that he could not find the name  
of it in your Manual and he promises  
me to send me once said Manual. I  
received it & by overlooking the  
same I found your notice about Salo.  
p. 678. (5<sup>th</sup> Edit. 4<sup>th</sup> issue) and that was  
the cause, why I have send you one  
specimen.

If I had known that before resp. at  
the same time I discovered Salo, I would  
have taken more care about it. and  
would give you better information.

It is a fact, that *Selvinia* grows in  
Missouri, and I believe in abundance too  
but I can not say, if it is introduced  
from Europe; if it is naturalized, pro-  
pagating itself freely by spores or if  
it is spontaneous only in said slough,  
before I have made better observations.

I shall observe it as well as  
possible the coming season and will,  
if refined, gather as many specimens  
you wish.
