Hoping for the indulgence of my subscribers, I remain,

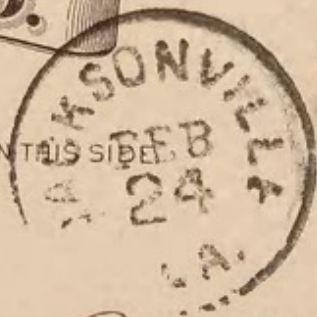
