The *Amorastylis* is white in color,
but no name.

Zephyranthes Lindleyana. Mr Pringle
wrote us ^{they} might ~~have~~ ^{be} some *Cooperiae*
Isomnoides mixed in, but as
Bond says *C. Isomnoides* has
white + red flowers we are not sure
but the one sent may be it.

The *Calochortus Bonplandianus*
sent in flower we concluded might
be *Cyclobuthus flava* we also send
one without the bulbs under

same name, Can you help
us out on these names?

The *Zigridia* Patscuaro I have
learned has not been named yet.
I took it from the Tag and as
it was not plain I thought of course
it was the proper name instead
of the name of the place where
it was found. Mr Horsford
left for St. Louis before the bulbs
were ~~etc~~ so I got no instructions
from him. I will see that
you have flowers of it if we have
any and they look now as if they
would flower later.
