Dear Gray - For the first time since I left Illinois I now write you - I have been very much employed collecting have been too busy to put up & send you specimens for name found myself with so much to do that I have neglected nearly all correspondence - I have confined my operations so far to the Willamette & Columbia Rivers & the Cascade Mountains - including Mount Hood I have now about 600 species the exact number not known - I have collected material to make 15 sets of nearly all the species I propose to remain here

another season and collect  
on this coast probably in  
Southern California - and  
I wish to send this seasons  
collection East for distribution  
& sale. There are no facilities  
easily procurable for doing the  
work here besides I think it  
can be done much cheaper in  
the East. I wish to ask  
you if the work could be  
done in Cambridge - I have  
thought that some young botanist  
would be willing to do it for  
one of the sets that is the  
labor part of it. I prefer that  
it shall be done there so as to  
be under your supervision.  
If you can get it done for  
me in this way please let  
me know as soon as possible.  
I have the collection now so far

as made closely packed in  
one large box ready for shipping  
when the season is over - now  
near at hand - Prof Tuck-  
erman will take the  
leaves entire & the  
Mosses & Hepaticae I will  
have sent to some specialist  
probably Desmognathus - I want  
to turn them also to some  
pecuniary account at some time.  
The terms on distribution I  
propose are as follows:  
The first full set to be yours. The second  
to be made very full and  
duplicated whenever the  
material is sufficient and to  
include all the species to be for  
myself. The third to be for the  
distributor of course full as  
complete as material will allow.
