My dear Mr. Gray,

I cannot find the letter mentioned in your note of the 28^o ult. acceding today; but I well remember Dr. Gray's speaking of the plants mentioned which grew on Stone Mountain Georgia. I had previously found *Giamorpha pusilla*, Kellale in great quantity there; but I was not sharp, as Dr. Gray was, to see that *Sedum pusillum*, Mickeo. was mixed with it. The two are extremely distinct and the ^{detaching} ~~falling~~ of

the latter
was an excellent re-discovery of
a rare plant.

Anything I can do to aid you
in regard to your work of late re-
specting Dr. Gray's letters would be
esteemed a privilege by me - for
Dr. Gray's memory will always be
precious to me.

I could not do otherwise than
I did about my Herbarium. It
was far too extensive for my case
and it was growing beyond any room
I could give it. It was better to have
it well settled while I was alive.
I do not regret the disposal of it.

I am now giving the little spare
time I have, to forming a new one
for a Natural History Society here.

Thanking you much for your
kindly interest in us, I am glad
to say that my boys and I are
quite well. My sister, who now
lives with and cares for us, is, how-
ever, quite frail. Her poor health
caused me to pass through Boston
last Saturday without getting out
to Cambridge which was a real privi-
