My dear friend,

A few days ago I wrote you about some  
grasses including also one, which  
I thought might prove to be a new  
species, but that even was an error.  
Dr. Kellogg having returned from  
Alaska submitted for investigation  
his grasses to me. Among these I  
found *Calamagrostis Lapponica*  
and by a careful investigation I  
came to the conclusion that my  
little plant must be referred to  
that species. My specimens  
are very small but in every other  
respect they agree. Ledebour's  
*Flora Russica* helped me more  
than Hensel.
