Hamburg the 25th April 1841.

My dear friend!

I beg Your pardon, that I have not already long before this thanked You for Your kind letter of June 8 20th August last which was accompanied by part 3 & 4 of Your beautiful Flora and many highly interesting plants. I had the intention to send at the same time with my answer in return a parcel of plants, but could as yet not gain the needful time to arrange them, my official station as Bibliothecary and Provost claiming all my activity for quite other objects than those which I love to converse with and of which the annexed pamphlet will serve as a proof. I must therefore defer the sending of plants to another opportunity.

I heartily rejoice to learn that You love to remember yet of Your brief visit with us. We have oft spoken of You in my house and my family as well as myself would be glad to greet You as an old friend if we should be happy enough to see You again.

I have been repeatedly desired to give a second edition of my Monography of the genus *Potentilla*, which work would appear indeed at present in quite another form, than 20 years ago. Meanwhile I intend to undertake as soon as time will allow is a revision of the said genus, to which purpose I would thank You for specimens of
