Dear Sir,

I wrote you lately in the beginning
of this year I think but I have no
answer from you. I fear that this frequent
mislead of my letters or else arises from
the ambiguity of the address, of Cambridge
in England, but I will always be sure
to write to Dr. The same thing has happened
perhaps with a letter addressed at the
end of 1878 or about to Mr. Lemmon. I
suppose, because I asked him some
new Triplaris and I have had no
answer from him. Have you any
news from him? I just wanted to
know the value of his Triplaris some few
days, and I fear this money didn't reach
to him. In my last letter I promised

to you an essay of Sicilian Plants
now this packet is ready to be shipped
and I hope in this same letter advise you
the steamer and the way in which the
packet has been addressed to you.

I hope these plants may be useful to you
or if not, I beg you to believe that I have
endeavored to give you such things which
generally are ignored by botanists, and
this in order to show you that I feel
much obliged to you for your kind assistance
in my work on *Triplaris*. I give these about
2000 "*Plantae Siculae rarioris*" to you, but
if you have already these species, I give these
to Bernard's university Herbarium or to Prof.
C. Gray to whom I feel too much obliged.
My work on *Amer. Triplaris* lies in my
desk or to speak more exactly is still en-
gaged in our University's meadows and I

have thought proper to include it in the letter
for my reason as Libucent or ex-amen
which I have already accomplished personally.

I am anxious to know if you or any
others have published some new *Triplaris*
new species have been perhaps discovered?
I hope you will be so kind to give me
written notices on these purposes.

If you have some new materials would you
be so kind to give me a specimen of
each new species? My work on *Triplaris*
Gerontogea is ready and I hope to get it
ready before the end of this year.

I wrote you lately advising you if
it was possible to sell centuries of
Sicilian Plants to Amer. Botanists, my
plants were the rarest as I collect only
the rare ones for the centuries which
bear the title of "*Plantae Siculae rarioris*"
