I wrote you lately in the beginning
of this year I think but I had no
answer from you. I fear that this frequent

to you an idea of Sicilian Plants
now this packet is ready to be shipped
and I hope in this same letter advise you
the steamer and the way in which the
packet has been addressed to you.
I hope these plants may be useful to you
or if not, I beg you to believe that I have
endeavored to give you such things which
generally are required by botanists, and
this merely to show you that I feel
much obliged to you for your kind assistance
in my work on Sippea. I give these above
200 "Plantae Sicilie rarois" to you, but
if you have already these species, I give these
to Harvard's University Herbarium or to Prof
C. Gray to whom I feel too much obliged.
My work on Amer Sippea lies mostly
dust, or to speak more exactly is still enga-
ged in our University's museum as I

had thought proper to include it in the titles
for my examination libidocent an examen
which I have recently accomplished favorably.
I am anxious to know if you or any
other have published some new Sippea
two species have been perhaps discovered?
I hope you will be so kind to give me
useful notices on these purposes—
If you have some new materials would you
be so kind to give me a specimen of
each new species? My work on Sippea
Genitaea is ready and I hope to get it
ready before the end of this year.
I wrote you lately asking you if
it was possible to tell certain of
Sicilian Plants to other botanists, my
plants are the rarest as I collect only
the rare ones for the Curious which
bear the title of "Plantae Sicilie rarois"
