Dr Wm. Hillebrand of Honolulu
who spent some time in this
State last summer. These
were furnished me by Mr
Bolander.

Also some collected
by W. H. Holder Esq., collected
near Oakland, also received
through Mr Bolander.

Also a few collected
by H. G. Bloomer Esq. near
Virginia City in Washoe.

The notes were copied
from my original notes
and I have looked over them
and made any corrections
& addition, that may
seem necessary. All the

Specimens collected
by myself except a very few,
are from the region of the
Sierra Nevada, the
altitudes given are supposed
exact for botanical purposes,
being the rough calculation,
from our ~~to~~ barometrical
observations - and correct
within a few feet.

In my notes, especially
where the specimens were
collected by others, I find
that sometimes a number
has been repeated, and I
think not often enough to
create any serious
