

My dear Mr. Drane; - Glenstown, 27 August, 1912

I should have made an earlier reply to your kind card but I have been pretty busy with collecting and travelling about. I went first to a farmhouse four miles from West Killarney and collected all about that region, getting over to Green's Lodge in Killeenry, the corner of Dunmore, and Strad Road in Berlin. I found some good things, of which Rhamnus alnifolia was the best. Gentiana linearis made access of meadow along the N. Branch of the Upper Annamiscus a brilliant blue. Strophos sp. turned up - a new genus for our list. Thence I went to Colebrook and visited ponds in Columbia and Stewartstown, adding to our list Potamogeton amplifolius and P. praecoxus. I also added Aster Lin. elegans which I had rather hoped for from that region. (It may be its pubescent variety.) Thence to Randolph for a few hours only, where I saw my mother and the cottage she is repairing, and then over here, where I have been up into the Gulf of Sholes, down the Glen Boulder Trail, up Raymond's Cataract, and about on the headwall of Huntington's and down Tickerman's. I am planning to find the Dismal Pool near Van Ellis and go back to Randolph on Thursday for work also and then rejoin Mr. Bran for a few days at Exeter. I trust that you and Mrs. Drane are well and hope that Mrs. C. is comfortable. I should like also to be remembered to the doctor. You can't always stay in a hotel where food is so delicious as one of the two County Stations for an indigenous plant! (Euphrasia Canad.). I observed that Oenothera intermedia is very common through this region. I had collected a little of it here before. With all best wishes, yours sincerely, A.S.P.
