I regret that Fraxinus anomala does not grow in this locality, and hence cannot give much information. The trees as I saw them growing in the Grand Canyon tended to sucker some. I think it is general with them. With reference to the occurrence of the compound leaves, I cannot say. At least, I have seen them growing on young vigorous shoots.

I am going to suggest that you have your friend write to Mr. Marcus Jones, Salt Lake City, Utah, who knows something about the ash of which you speak. He may be able to supply you with the seeds too.
