Dear Sir,

Glaving made an excursion in April toward the headwaters of Concho river. I have found a few forms of which I send you some specimens (as good as I have found them so early in season). in a package mailed in same time that this letter:

1 Notholaena sinuata ^{yes} - on twin Mt. 5.
- near Fort Concho. - grows in deep
fissures of exposed rocks on high bluff.
- also found on a few peaks on the
upper Concho.

2 - Dealbata - on Comanche's peak
on west side. June 1882. - on rocks
partly shaded: occurs in Palo Pinto co.

also

3 Chailanthus tomentosa near Brazos station

✓
(Palo Pinto Co.) 15 May 1882. - occurs in
good many places west of the Brazos
on shaded rocks.

4 Cheilanthes leucoginorea found on the top
of Tower Mountain near Sterling
creek (Com Green Co.) on exposed
rocks (south west side) April. 1882.

5 same as 4 found on several high bluffs.
on the upper benches; occur on
exposed rocks. seems quite different from
the no 3 and 4.

6 alabamensis. ^{yes} - though it occurs
in several places in this state. I found
it only in Brown Co. between the
Pecan bogon and Indian creek. on
shaded rocks. April. 1882.
