found, so we must keep a
sharp look out. My kingdom
for fruit of *Arethusa bulbosa*!

I have collected piles of the flowers
of course, but have never been
able to mark plants for fruit
and late leaves. Have never
found anybody who has done
it. My duplicate list is in
Minn. and strictly I ought to
wait till I have made one or
~~two previous exchanges~~, but I
think I will mail you a
Patterson's list in which my
duplicates are marked also
with the exception of Canaries.
They don't count. It is a
clumsy size and I shall
pay the return postage, as it
is rather an imposition to send
so large a vol. If you will
give me a list of your wants
I would like to send them soon,
to check off the exchange. Save
a rooting spec. with ripe fruit of that
Alyssum for me. Ever Walter Deane.
