It is my satisfying to know that my 807 runs like *P. Smithii* to you. I was inclined to think so but had no full description of *P. Ohioense* to compare it with. The material I sent to you was put under slight pressure before thoroughly dry, and other plants that dried without pressure have leaves more closely appressed.

If you ever wish more material I will gladly supply you. I collected quite generously and

mean to get more still in a day  
or so as I came upon quite a  
good sized patch that was one  
mass of capsules.

When Dr. Farlow returns I do so  
hope you will have something de-  
finite to tell us about the var.  
perigoniae.
