Thank you very much for  
the specimen of *Philonotis fallax*  
and the sample of conjugated paper.  
Mr. Champlaine has recently re-  
determined his *Philonotis* from Biscay  
Aug. 1898, *P. fallax* but it is only a  
bird as high as your specimen.  
There seems to be considerable interest  
in my "approach" to *P. Smitiae*, judg-  
ing from the acceptances I have already  
received from professors and others.  
Even Prof. Heege thinks he may like  
50+ specimens after he "first inspects  
me." He'll have to wait for this year's

crop. It might be well to send a  
little article about it to the Bryologist.  
Do you mind if I quote from your  
letter written at the time you com-  
menced my specimens with Dr. Grout's?  
I think it will be of interest to all.
