my moss is *Tayloria*.  
I have sent some  
to Farlow & shall  
hope to have his  
reply soon.

Have you any  
record of *Tayloria*  
*serrata*? I have  
only been able to  
find one U. S. station  
the Fort Colville in  
Lieut James Manual.

That place is in  
Washington Territory  
near the British Col.  
Boundary line.  
Macoun gives  
several Canadian  
stations.
