Conn. R. meadows. I know
that you do not do much
with hepaticae, but thought
that you might like it
as it is new to N.E. It
grew in this big shaded

ditch, the Aphanorrhagma was mixed with it. That ditch was full of good things, other Riccias and Anthocerotaceae, including Anth Macounii Howe which had not previously been found south of Marine.

The Physcomitrium was abundant along the river bank a few miles further south. It grew on sandy banks shaded by tall grasses, &c.

It was in Europe until

August, got lots of specimens. all which I have not yet had time to look.

Then we went back to Marinilla so na, but I got very few mosses.

Have you been back to the Gaule? Marinilla this year?
