Mr. Bartlett, the new Commissioner for Mexican Boundary, Prof. Henry writes me is an intimate acquaintance of ~~his~~,
With Ewing's general recommendation, I

hope he will be able to procure general good offices & aid. I got the enclosed to-day. And write to Henry at once

to learn if I can pay over \$150 to the Commissioner to be paid over to you in Texas.

Putting across to El Paso with the Boundary Survey Party, you could catch a good chance of getting into Utah, or into the region between El Paso & California —

I will ask Prof. Henry to empower the Commissioner to pay over to you his appropriation for this year if you get fairly into the field.

Collect especially seeds of Pines, and other trees. I will write again in a few days. — Yours cordially
