Harwichport, July 7, 1919

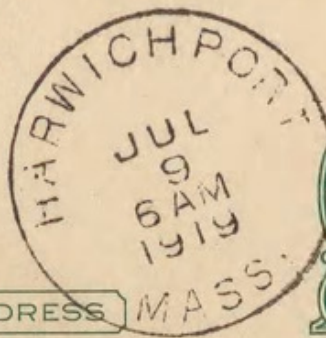
I find that I forgot to bring any straps for presses! I had left the frames and the driers here but took the straps back to Cambridge. I need 6 pairs, but it is
