Dear Dr. Robinson:-

I send with this card
some Stachys, Germanica and
what I take to be Jasione montana.
for the Gray Herb.

The latter has been growing for several
years (at least 5), I am told by resi-
dents of Conanicut Island, where it
occurs, at this station. I have ~~some~~
specimens collected more than a mile
apart. and Sunday ^(4th) saw a field that
was decidedly blue with the flowers -
a field of at least a few acres

I am not positive of the determination
as we have but poor specimens of
Jasione in B. W. Herb. and if not
too much trouble would like to have
you compare these with Gray Herb. spec-
imens and let me know the result,
also have you any record of its
occurrence before in this country?

We have recently had Antithyllis vulneraria
sent in for determination from
N. Brookfield Mass.
