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My dear Dr. Jones!

Yours welcome letter, dated Jan. 22, arrived here a few days ago. Many thanks for your proposals.

I will write to Vicuna and see, if I cannot yet for you the paper from Kraenzlin on the new Philippine - Orchids. He has last year brought out for a prospectus of the genus Telipogon. This I will try to get at the same time.

You do not write to me, that you have got my manuscript with the key to the groups and the enumeration of the genera for the Folio. I hope it has not gone astray. The manuscript was sent off here by registered book-post on the 18 Dec. Please let me know at once, if you have received it, then otherwise I might reclame at the Post.

As to the copying of the analyses and working sketches of my types of the groups, that you are working on, I am quite willing and glad to get done for you here, whatever

you ask for. I will ask one of our best
draughtsmen ~~and~~ for his terms. At our
present low rate of valuta 100 dollars will
although prices have risen here for everything
very much, go a long way. I expect the best
will be, if I will get tracings made of the
analyses. Some samples I will send you soon,
and then you can let me know, if they will
meet ^(with) your approval.

As to going to Vienna, I have enquired
to-day from Mr. Lamilla Schneider, who is
working here in our Museum at present. He
is from Vienna and has only lately been
there. He tells me, that for the voyage
there and the return to go and return
and about two weeks stay in Vienna
I would need, if the prices are not going
to be raised again, roughly speaking
4000 Marks, that is at the present rate
of our valuta 65-70 dollars. I expect in
two weeks I could finish looking up the
species, that you are at present specially
interested in and at once copy the drawings
that are to be found in Reichenbach's Herbarium.

view nearly for each species. If you should wish me to go, I would ask you, to give me plain powder & to try to get from the Vienna authorities, wherever possible, a flower of the types (^{for you}) and offer them on your behalf specimens of your types in exchange. I expect this would meet your approval?

I am now busy preparing the manuscripts of the Orchids - compilations of the Cordilleran sketches for the printers. If all goes well they will start with the printing next week and I hope to get the whole work, i.e. the last three remaining parts, published within the next 6 months.

Of course any of the changes, that you propose as to the spelling of the odd names I would consent to, and see to it that they are equally written in any of my future manuscripts.

As to Bolpe's collaboration, I expect it is best to wait yet until we have got the

"Folia" well started. For certain groups we
rather genera, like for instance Gutteux
and Odonotoglossum, he certainly has got
a wider knowledge than any body else. We
might perhaps later on ask him to do these
and some others, but as I think, it is per-
haps better to wait yet a little with this.

In December I had written to him and
proposed an exchange of our publications,
