flamed at my plant collection opposite La Llorona, when I lived
for many years & gave up in 1951.

There is no record unfortunately of the locality, which I often
was Bogotá (not the Chingui one) on the Pan American Highway at about 3,500 -
ft., & I will appreciate very highly your goodness in sending me its name.
It is a plant of lovely caespitose growth & worthy of a place in any
'botanical' collection. I shall hope to obtain a photo of which if
you will you shall have a copy. No collection occurs to me of
seeing it before; it recalls somewhat Odont. Hamatum.

I have been saddened & hear a number of the illness of

Mr. Dillon he must have been overwhelmed with work for the
Orchid Congress now imminent. Though I never had the privilege of
meeting him, he was kind enough to write to me several times.

It is back to you first & the hope it may retain some

for you to see.
