Dear Dr. Kennedy: -

Am sorry to hear that you have the distemper, if it can be called such, which seems to be going the rounds, and hope you will get rid of it very quickly.

I have had more than a week of it myself since I saw you last, but seem to be all right again now, or very nearly so.

I suspect your specimen from the deep pool under the rock is, as you surmised, a Neelichhoferia or something very near that. Since writing you about Desmazium elongatum (of which I have several packets) I have found one package of the moss under discussion collected ^{by} you. I have not yet overhauled it however.

I enclose the Sphocidium.
