I see you made a note after Hyp. eugynium that you "don't know yet, shall look at it again." I suspect you have not had a chance to examine it again so if I do not hear from you to the contrary I shall omit it from this list.

Do you have any positive recollection of any Nielichhoferia having been reported from the White Mts?

Have you any suggestionⁱⁿ addition to what you have said in regard to Webera elongata macracarpa which was "apparently"?

If you think I had better mention the stricklandii and Mimium will you please return the drawings as I may need them in preparing my notes.

If I have asked too many questions tell me to do as I like or something similar or worse. If I do not hear from you by Friday morning I shall have to do as I please anyway.
