Dear Dr. Kennedy,

Your letter came to hand today, you have one thing that no one else has reported, *Anacamptodan*. *Hypnum ochraceum* has not been found before except by Frost.

Don't put any faith in Macoun's *Exsiccati*, they are unreliable in doubtful cases. I have seen *Hypnum Richardsoni* from Vt. however.

I should be exceedingly glad of specimens of the species you name and will try to make it right with you. Can you tell me, ⁱⁿ what herbaria you have deposited the *Anacamptodan*. In the case of species collected only once I want to tell where it can be found. If you have not enough *Anacamptodan* to spare me a fragment I should be greatly obliged if you would send it to me so that I may get a look at it.

If I can be of any service to you in wrestling with your "treasures" call on me freely.

Many thanks for your additions.
