Dear George,

I was very
glad to get your letter with
the account of your
voyage. I am so sorry

the sailing list - and would

Holland with headquarters
at the Hague - only I had
to go alone on a new

line. I have been thrice
to Holland and it is to me

than the Arabic and
never on so clean a one.

I found my old rooms
here all ready for me

he sails this coming week
