“Exhibition of the Roxbury Latin School.—

This Exhibition, on Wednesday of this week; was largely attended, and the Exercises are of an unusually interesting character. These consisted principally of Declamations and Compositions. Of the former, “The Battle of Regillus”, spoken by W. R. Nichols, Geo. Tripp, R. P. Anderson, E. A. Capen, F. J. Clark, C. C. Dean and A. H. Hall, was highly creditable, as also was “Virginia”, recited by C. Lester, G. S. Kennedy, J. C. Soley, F. Anderson and D. G. Haskins. Several original compositions were read, among which, a gentleman who was present speaks ~~of~~ in high terms of one on “The Advance of Intellect” by Stephen Dracopole. An original Latin Dialogue, by Masters Hodges and Dorr, was witty and amusing, and the Valedictory Address, by C. C. Dean, was an entirely successful performance.
