Dear Mr. Deane: -

Having exchanged heavily with Europe and in blanco (or "blanket", as some botanists express it), I have a large number of duplicates, nearly as many as those incorporated with my herbarium, or about 5000 sheets of foreign plants. I remember that you exchanged such plants with me about 8 or 10 years ago, and I thought therefore, that you possibly could wish to have more of the kind, so I made out a list of duplicate plants referred to in Gray's Manual 2d. VII. (You did not want other plants than those growing here too) You can have the whole set or pick out what numbers you want, and you can return other plants or buy them, just as you prefer.

If you know of any persons making up foreign collections, I would be thankful for any information. It is quite a bother to have too many duplicates, especially when not American.

The plants are acceptable - you know that I

am rather difficult to please as to the right preparation of specimens. A few are not as they ought to be, but I can keep them here, and not make others unhappy by becoming owners of them.

It is the day of Thanking. I lost all the crops on my farm this summer, and I am not such a big coward to be thankful for the loss, but could possibly find some more pleasant things or causes for thanksgiving, if I make up my mind. Some people thank for everything, even when they get haled out, as I was.
