I have received your letter of Jan. 19, and I have prepared a list of foreign plants growing in this country as stated by Gray's Manual 7th Ed., except four or five that did not come in there by accident, but growing in its territory. The list contains 326 species. I think that 8 cents for each species is a price not excessive.

The new revision of Coulter's flora by Prof. Aron Nelson came as a most agreeable surprise the other day. Prof. Nelson has made a terrible carnage among new species, and did not even save a number of his own species. It is certainly a most conservative work, and I don't believe there is one species too much.
