I too often think of my old friend of the White Mountain country and have many a time longed for a renewal of that pleasant summer when I had together at Shelburne.

On two days notice I packed my bag and got on a train for the far west. Headquarters flays that sort of trick on me quite often these busy days in the service. But the duty I am now engaged with is not a very pleasant one. Two brother officers are being court martialed for irregularities in office. One being of high rank had to be tried by his peers. Therefore to get the necessary talent together the people in Washington had to go all the way East for one member of the court and to Detroit for another member. While the remaining officers comprising the court were selected

from those already on the west coast.

The Seattle climate is fine and in reading the news for the day notice you are having one storm after another. So I can be glad for one thing - a selfish matter though - I am missing some regular New England weather. Mrs M - and Barbara are in New London but hope they are not suffering much inconvenience as a result of my sudden and unlooked for absence. I expect to return East in about another week.

I trust you are feeling well. Like you I despise winter weather. The climate is ideal here. Seattle is a very wide awake and up and doing place. It is beautifully located on Puget Sound with mountain ranges snow covered the year round.

The famous Mt. Rainier is a sight never to be forgotten at sunset on a clear evening.
