

Gymnocarpus virginicum, and near

The plant has a peculiar glaucous
appearance.

I send specimens to Prof. Salter,
also.

I am just returned from the
Mt. Mansfield region: The *Woodsia*
were coming out, and I selected
for you a little clump which
will pass for *hypnorum*, I think,
when fully developed.

My Dear Mr. Davenport:

Since you have decided
against my cedar swamp *Betula* being
simplex (I feel sure it should
have the peculiar, simply pinnate,
character of the sterile *Agave*, constant
& maintained and never carried
into the more dissected state of
macrocarpaefolia, be regarded as a
distinct and permanent variety at-
least.) I want to try again for
simplex, this time with some speci-
mens found June 4/77 in an
open hill-pasture in this town
in company with *Ophioglossum*,
