I am willing to buy of Latham, if his specimens are tolerably good, for well thought.

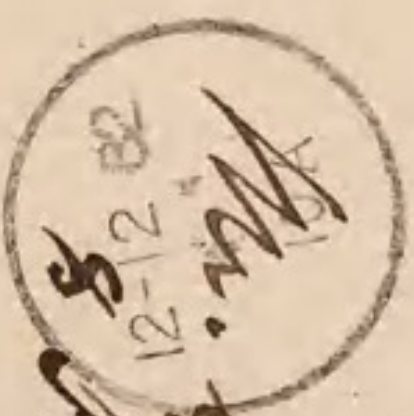
