The letter promised by your last card does not come before I start.

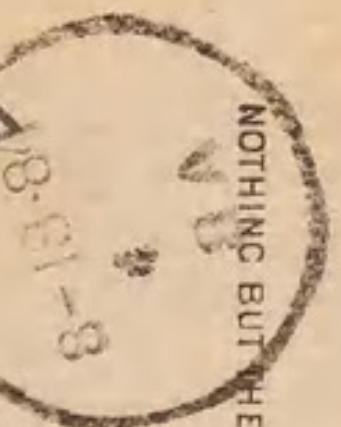
