My dear Sir

Your letter inquiring
about *Aspidium spinulosum* Sw. is before
me. In reply I may say that I can get a
plenty of what I have always called by the
above name & which answers the description.
I may be in error in regard to it. I have now
no specimens that I can send but can send lots
of it next season if it is what you want. It
is now several years since I have paid any very
close attention to ferns, except to cultivate them,
& I am rather mety upon the subject. I have not
Swartz's description & refer to & so can not be
sure that I have ever found the true *Spinulosum*.

as it may all be very intermediate, we have
also the other varieties, *Bontii* & *oblitatum* here. My
chief work is in Zoology, though I am greatly
interested in Fungi & formerly spent some time on
them. I shall be glad to help you if I can. I think
I can get the *Batrychium simplex* in the summer
but am not sure of finding it. I have on hand
no duplicates now but if you will write me
in the summer when I can collect I shall be
happy to be of service to you. I doubt much if
Ast. Lancastriensis be anything else than a form
of *Ast. cristatum* as that varies somewhat &
might approach a form like *Lancastriense* readily I
think. I am sorry that I am at present
unable to help you. I can get in abundance the
following species which I would like to exchange for any that
in my collection I have all that you have marked & most of the
others marked - *Camptodes* *Obliquum*, *Peltaea gracilis*, *Aspid.*
Goldmannii, *Aspid.* *spinulosus* var. ^{Asplen.} *34*, *Augustifolium* - *Asperula*
Murana.
