Dear Mr. Deane:

In reply to your recent inquiries concerning the two species of *Panicum* mentioned I give the following notes on the specimens in my herbarium:

*Panicum mattamuskatense*, Ashe. ! Wellesley, Mass. Dry bank in woods. June 14, 1899. Coll. W. P. R. A note by Scribner and Merrill is written on the sheet as follows: "Ashe's type of *P. mattamuskatense* differs from this only in having the nodes longer bearded (2 mm.) and leaf margins not ciliate"

My specimen has lower sheaths and all nodes pubescent and therefore cannot be *P. Clutei* as you describe it in your letter. (Cited in *Rhodora* 3, May, 1901).

Re *Panicum commutatum*, Schult. all my specimens were determined by Scribner & Merrill to be *P. Ashei*, Pearson.



I find no sheet of this species (*P. commutatum*)  
from Wellerley in 1899.
