Dear Mr. Deane: coming the two species of Pamicine mentioned give the following notes on the specimens in my herbarium: Pancem mattemeskatence, Ashe. ! Wellerly, Mass. Dry bank in woods. June 14, 1899. Coll. M. P. R. a note by Scribner and Merrice is worten on the sheet as foclows: Ashes type of P. mattamuskatence differs from this only in having the nodes longer bearded (2 mm) and leaf margens not celiate" my specimen has lower sheaths and all nodes publicent and therefore cannot be P. Clutei as you describe it in your letter. (Ceted in Rhodora 3, may, 1901).

Re Pancin commitation, Schult. all my speciments were determined by Scribner Merrice to be P. asher, Vearson.

Ifind no sheet of this species (P. commutation) from Mellerley in 1899. With Kind regard
