Thank you for all your
kind notes and your kindly interest.
My mother has very likely told you
that Mr. Foster had to have a slight
subsidiary operation to remove an
infection that developed (on one of the
testicles). He came through that, with a
local anesthetic, very well and though
he is very weak, the doctor is again
encouraged. He says that if
it were any other case, he should say
the patient would get well; but he
never knows what will happen in
this one. Mr. Foster himself says
he is like an old machine; they
no sooner get one part fixed up

than another goes bad!

The weather here is marvellous -
day after day of clear, open cloudless
skies and sunshine so bright that it
quite dazzles northern eyes. ~~Just~~
Day before yesterday the thermometer
stood at eighty in the middle of the
day. The grass is getting green in
places, elm trees are in bloom. So
are dandelions, shepherd's purse,
and in the gardens, English violets
and Japanese quince. All the same,
I'd rather be back in New England
with the snow.
