

SPECIFIC CHARACTER.

Violet-black Snake, with the abdomen and fides crimfon; the fcuta margined with black.

Abdominal Scuta 188. Anal. 7. Subcaudal Scales 4.5.

THIS beautiful Snake, which appears to be unprovided with tubular teeth or fangs, and confequently not of a poifonous nature, is about three, and fometimes four feet in length. Its colour on the upper parts is a gloffy violet-black; the fides of an elegant deep crimfon, which on the abdomen declines into a paler tinge, or more approaching to whitifh; while the fcuta or broad femicircular fcales which compofe this part, are each deeply bordered with black. The alternate fcales or divided fcuta beneath the tail are of a lead-colour, and the largeft feries of the crimfon fide-fcales are tipped with black ; which gives them an appearance peculiarly elegant. This Snake may be confidered as a fpecies hitherto undefcribed.
