

Phil^a Mar 10th 1856

Dear Dr. Gray -

Your last letter, saying that I have not sent you
plates was rec'd in New York - a day or two after my return
a fine printing office to was destroyed by fire within 25 feet of ~~the~~
buildings in which I have my rooms, I fell on the ice, &
an empty horse carriage, being backed out ran over me &
lamed my arm so badly that I could not use it until to
day; the doctor has been here for some time & said he would
write to you.

I have been working for some time with our most
difficult (the coloring) Steel plates, with other duties, but do the
neglect however of your plates - all the drawings & then I
have not done some time since, I have made Daugel go
over nearly all the last 30 or 40 plates - proofs would have
been sent you before now, but Daugel ^{had} no printer at
work for ~~for~~ ~~now~~ some time, I shall go to Washington
in a short time & bring them all to Phil^a; if I can do no
better, as to the lettering, I can have ~~it~~ ^{done} fine plates
done while one is printing, I am exceedingly anxious
to get my steel book off my hands, & also to complete
your atlas - how many more plates are there to be
engraved per ~~year~~ ^{month} the atlas to your first Volume?
