Dear Dr Gray

In answer to your letter
of the 17th, I will explain my
orders given to bind up of the Govt.
copies, only as many as were reque-
sted for present distribution; then
remained in Gaskells store room,
21 copies of all the Vols from 8
to 18 inclusive, besides a large
amt in parts, bound, & partly bound
belonging to different publishers,

There were only 21 copies of
Mr Brackenridges book (Govt.)
lent —

Patnam Collo had Mr B's own
book on sale, I could not tell
the volume edition of Burns to any
bookseller, P. Collo was to have
the books from time to time
as they wanted them; and, have
Mr B. outlay, I had only 20 copys
of his plates printed, P. Collo had
10 copies all of which are sold.

Mr B. leaves therefore only
10 copies of his plates, but
all the letter press is burned
except the said 10 copies sold -

You shall have a set of
the plates for your copy of
B's book -

I had a talk with Mr
Purse this morning at the
Capitol, I am to see him again
to morrow, & I feel pretty sure
the com^{ee} will ask for the
means this session to reprint
I have suggested stereotyping
