in his proceeding or his own honest understanding,  
but that the parties may have in  
a great degree misunderstood each other,  
a thing by no means unlikely to happen:  
to avoid which <sup>is my duty in the present occasion</sup>  
My letter to Dr. Torrey of the 31<sup>st</sup> last, was  
solely based upon what he had written to  
me, <sup>& it certainly gave me the impression</sup>  
~~which statements did appear to me~~  
~~that there had been an unnecessary~~  
~~to indicate a needless & vexatious interference~~  
with details that should <sup>have been</sup> left, as I supposed  
they were expressly arranged to be left, to the  
botanists themselves to determine: In my  
reply to Dr. Torrey I accordingly suppressed my  
sentiments in respect to it, as represented to  
me - Sentiments ~~to be agreed~~, concurred in  
by the highest <sup>botanical</sup> scientific authority in England  
in such matters.  
I should add, in view of the unpleasantness in the simple discharge  
of what I conceived to be my duty as unexpectedly involved me, that  
I ~~would~~ <sup>want</sup> further to say that I ~~saw~~ <sup>saw</sup> not desirous to exercise that general oversight

of the whole botanical publication which  
I deemed myself charged with, & to wh.,  
if I mistake not, a plain reference will be  
found in the written <sup>engagement</sup> ~~contract~~ I act under -  
It is of no earthly object whatever to me, except  
as it might tend, as my associates assured  
me it would, to the ~~greater~~ perfection of the  
work; & it is solely from my strong desire to  
~~render the work~~ <sup>in</sup> ~~the most accurate~~ <sup>and creditable</sup>  
~~possible~~ in the highest degree <sup>to</sup> the country, in  
form & matter, that I have been ~~led~~ <sup>drawn</sup> into  
this unpleasant discussion; which must  
not be prolonged - At least I will take no

guilt

I am content to be alone responsible, as I must  
be, in substance & in language, for that large portion  
of the botanical report which is assigned to me to  
execute, in respect to which, indeed, I have received  
no instructions since our written contract was  
made, & I trust I shall receive none at variance with it.

With respect to the Declaration <sup>no intention to arrest</sup> ~~on the part~~ of Capt. Wilkes, of ~~stopping the~~ <sup>myself</sup> bills  
<sup>(in conformity with my contract)</sup> drawn upon the Committee, until I shall  
give assurances of conforming to "new <sup>or</sup> intentions"  
<sup>of his</sup> ~~instructions~~ As me either unknown,  
or Capt. Wilkes intimates, misrepresented &  
you will allow me to remark, should <sup>it</sup> have only to say, that of the Library Committee  
take the responsibility ~~on~~ <sup>of</sup> of accepting ~~in~~  
~~this or in any other way~~ <sup>my</sup> portion of the  
Botanical work, I shall naturally regret  
the throwing away of so much labor & re-  
search, & the failure of the opportunity of  
contributing, in this <sup>particular way</sup> ~~to~~ <sup>so far as I am</sup> the advance-  
ment of American science; <sup>but</sup> personally  
concerned I shall have no reason to regret it.  
as the present aspect of affairs, I cannot  
fail to form a very faint ~~belief~~ to me
