Dear Dr. B. L. Robinson

As Mr. Rose is absent for a month. I forward the two sets of Acapulco plants you expressed a desire to have. The box marked set 1. is the most complete and is sent for your herbarium. It contains 595 specimens at 10 dollars per hundred, 59.50. Set 2 contains 555 specimens - 55.50.

Labels (extra) with instruction for set two are sent in separate envelope.

The extra labels are sent so that if a plant is without, the number on the right hand corner of the sheet can be added.

And in case the number of a label do not correspond with that of the corner the latter is correct being added when the plants were put on single sheets from the original packages.

There is numerous packages of seeds in the box look out that none are thrown away with the wads of packing paper.

## Set 2

Instructions to be sent with it.

In closed is a package of labels so that if any plant is without one you will find the number for it on the right hand corner of the sheet.

And if the number on any label does not correspond with that on the corner of the sheet the latter is the correct one being put on from the original package of plants at the time the specimen was put on the single sheets for distribution into sets.

As there is numerous packages of seeds between the bundles of plants take care none are thrown away when the <sup>loads</sup> of packing paper is discarded.
