A Replacement Name for *Lepidostoma weaveri* Bueno, Santiago, and Barba
(Trichoptera: Lepidostomatidae)

In a recent paper on Trichoptera collected in Mexico and Panama (Bueno-Soria et al. 2004:481), we described the new species *Lepidostoma weaveri*, unfortunately overlooking the fact that Harris (1986:36) earlier had used *weaveri* for a species of *Lepidostoma* from Alabama. *Lepidostoma weaveri* Bueno, Santiago, and Barba, 2004, is thus a junior primary homonym and must be renamed. We here propose *Lepidostoma textor* Bueno, Santiago, and Barba, **new name**, for *Lepidostoma weaveri* Bueno, Santiago, ad Barba, 2004. The specific epithet is Latin for weaver. It is a noun in apposition in honor of John Weaver.
