Thamnophis butleri again in Pennsylvania.—MR. Henry W. Fowler remarked that on July 3, 1907, he had secured an example of this species at Warren, in Warren County. As it has not before been recorded from this part of the State, this record may prove of interest, though specimens have been secured as far east as Port Allegheny in McKean County, as recorded by Stone, and later by Ruthven. Cope originally obtained Pennsylvanian specimens near Franklin, in Venango County, and described them as Eutania brachystoma.
